In Defense of Freedom

T USBAND AND WIFE

Bernabe Loret de Mola and Yvonne Conde may have followed different paths to America, but their hearts arrived in the same place: filled with a profound love for America and a deep concern over where it may be heading.

Bernabe, or "Barney" as he is known to friends, was born in Cuba but attended boarding school in the United States from a young age. When he was 15, he and his mother left Cuba for good and emigrated to New York City, and like many newly arrived immigrants, they worked around the clock to make a new life there.

Barney eventually enrolled in City College of New York, where he admits being exposed to the socialist sentiments pervasive in so many college campuses during the 1950s. Later, as Barney made his own way through medical school, he started to understand the importance of valuing what you earn and, perhaps more importantly, how taking self-sufficiency away from people is problematic in a free society. Barney was eventually drafted into the Navy, where he served as a doctor during the Vietnam War. His wartime experience further reinforced a shift toward a more conservative worldview than he held during his early days at City College.



Yvonne, also born in Cuba, took a more perilous route to the United States. Yvonne's family experienced Castro's revolution firsthand, and, like many families at the time, initially supported the fight against the previous regime's corruption. Yvonne's family soon realized this was merely a pretense for the hardline communist regime that ensued. The Catholic schools where she had once studied were abolished, and children were sent to Russia and parts unknown for communist indoctrination. People's movements were monitored, and their lack of attendance at local party meetings was recorded. Personal property was seized. Severe food shortages became the norm. Seemingly overnight, they found themselves living in a dystopian communist nightmare.

Eventually, Yvonne was one of the more than 14,000 unaccompanied children sent to America under the program known as "Operation Pedro Pan." In fact, she has written one of the definitive books on that subject. Some children were received by extended family members in the United States; others passed through a series of foster families coordinated primarily through Catholic charities. Yvonne was fortunate enough to have her mother join her after a year of experiencing what she gratefully refers to as "the kindheartedness of Americans," but when airline flights between the two countries ceased in 1962, many families were left permanently separated.

Though Barney and Yvonne may have been introduced to America in different ways, when asked what most concerns them today, their answer is immediate and passionately unified: the loss of freedom of expression.

"What does it say about our country when we can't walk down the streets of New York City wearing a piece of clothing in support of our candidate of choice without fear of being physically injured?" says Yvonne. "We are seeing our freedom of expression eroded, and this is truly scary to me. Freedom is why I came to this country! And when that freedom is gone, what will we lose next?" Barney adds, "There was a Cuban-born American, Maximo Alvarez—also a Pedro Pan refugee who summed it up best at the Republican National Convention this year. He said he would never forget his father's words to him: 'We have nowhere else to go.'"

It was Yvonne and Barney's love for America—and concern for its future—that led them to include a provision for Heritage in their estate plans. "We're thinking about the future because what we see happening in America today didn't just occur overnight, says Barney. "It's been developing for many years, and the danger isn't going to go away."

"I want Heritage's light and ideas to keep shining for future generations," says Yvonne. "We believe America's ideals must continue. When we're no longer on this earth, it's important for us to know what we've left will be put to good use."

This language can be added to an existing will very easily and at minimal expense. It is recommended that an attorney provide assistance. The Heritage Foundation's federal tax identification number is 23-7327730.

You may also consider making Heritage the beneficiary of your **IRA**, **insurance policy, commercial annuity,** or any other account that allows you to name a beneficiary upon death. This is a wonderful way to leave a legacy for America, and all that's typically required is your signature on a change of beneficiary form.
